Dr. Lurie is a psychiatrist and a psychotherapist. Dr. Lurie is a director of adult clinic, Shalvata mental health center, Clalit Health Service Fund, and the chairperson of the Israeli Community Mental Health Society.

Between the years 2003-2014 Dr. Lurie has volunteered at the Open Clinic for Work Migrants and Asylum Seekers, Physicians for Human Rights (PHR)- Israel. Between the years 2014-2018 he was one of the founders and the first director of "Gesher" (Hebrew- Bridge) clinic, Ministry of Health, Israel- a clinic for asylum seekers and victims of trafficking. Dr. Lurie is a candidate for senior lecturer in the psychiatry department, Sackler school of medicine, Tel Aviv university (TAU). In addition, he is an adjunct lecturer in the department of epidemiology and preventive medicine, school of public health, Sackler school of medicine, TAU.

Dr. Lurie is involved in international training and workshops on identification and treatment of victims of human trafficking with the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and worked as a mental health consultant at the UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR)-Israel.

His main areas of research are immigration, culture, trauma, human rights and socio-economic inequality.
